



Partial Eclipse begins: 2:14 Totality begins: 3:26:20

Totality ends: 3:29:42 (that's an incredible 3 minutes 22 seconds of totality!)

Partial Eclipse ends: 4:37

- * NASA recommends 1 pair of glasses per 3 people you do not need glasses at all during totality!
